Treasurer's Report

Statement of Operations - We have generated \$526.3k in YTD General Income. Our YTD Expenses are \$558.3k. Giving was high in Nov thanks to the success of the Preparing the Way campaign. But expenses were high as well. Reporting only General Income, we would still have a ~\$18.5k deficit. However, some of the ERC tax credits applied for in 2023 have been approved and were received in November resulting in a +\$45k balance. As we had not counted on these funds awaiting their approval, this is truly a timely blessing! These funds will be held in reserve, building upon the Preparing the Way campaign to strengthen our foundation, support OSLC as our ministry grows, and will be made available in the event that our expenses exceed our giving." See original communication on ERC tax filing in the Pulse dated 12/18/2024 under "Financial Report".

Balance Sheet & Cash Flow - The total of cash and accounts receivable is \$220.2k. Funds allocated to dedicated accounts is \$207.4k. This is very positive that we now have enough cash to cover ou dedicated funds.
